

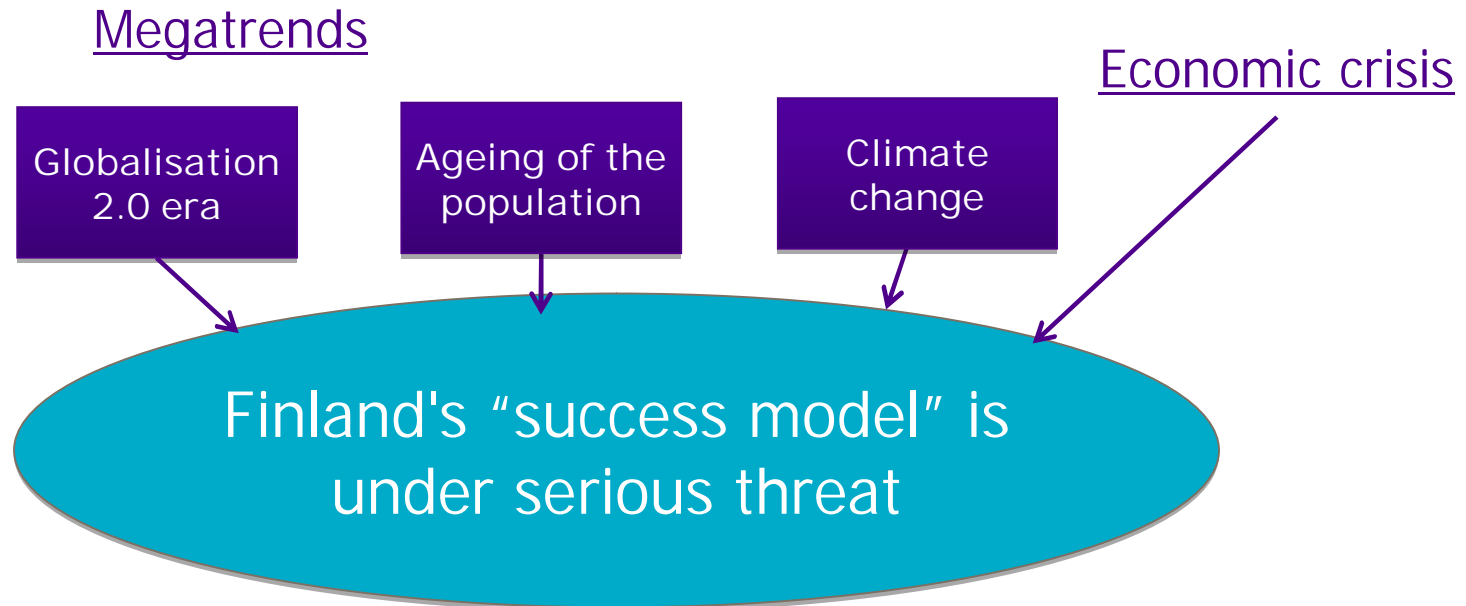

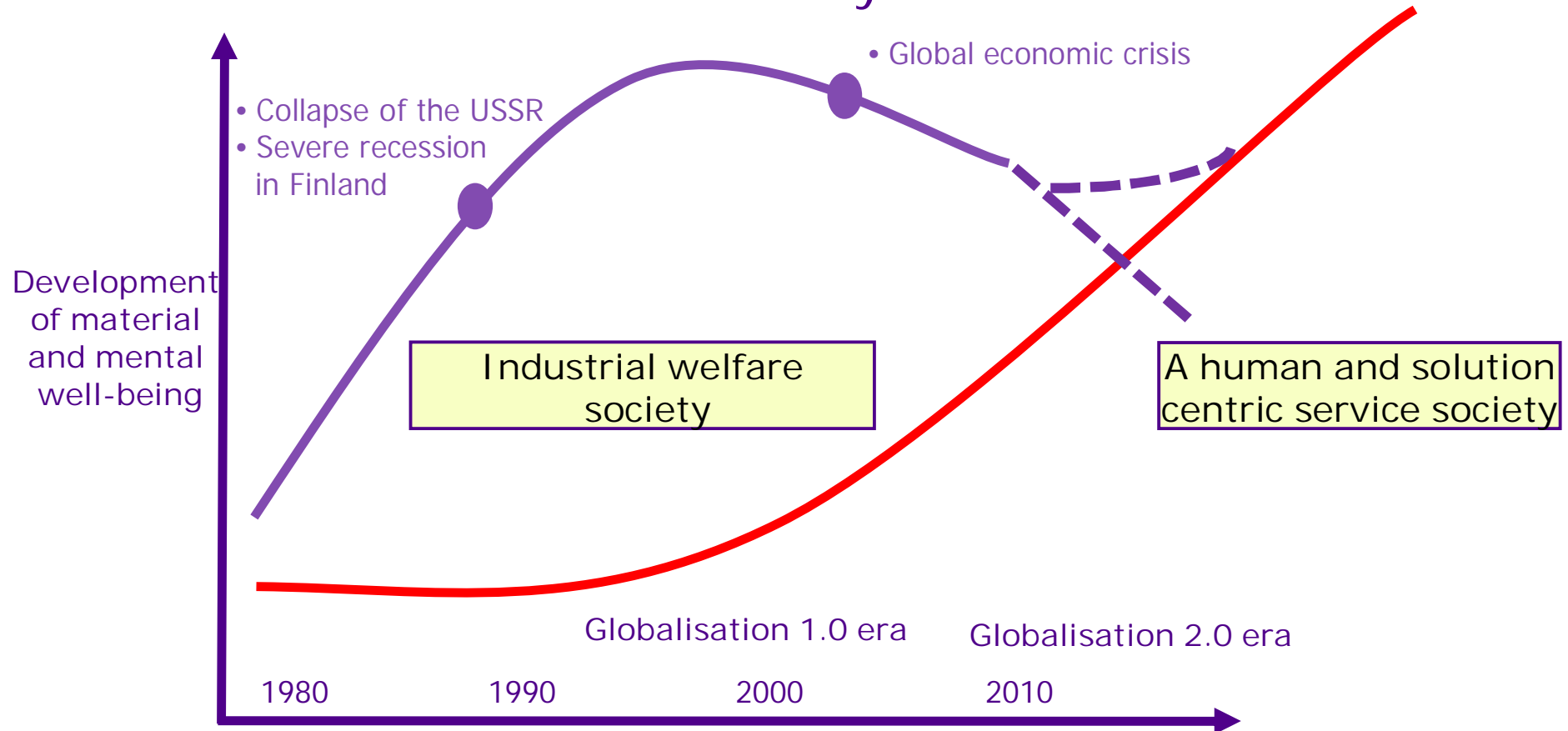

World around us is changing rapidly...

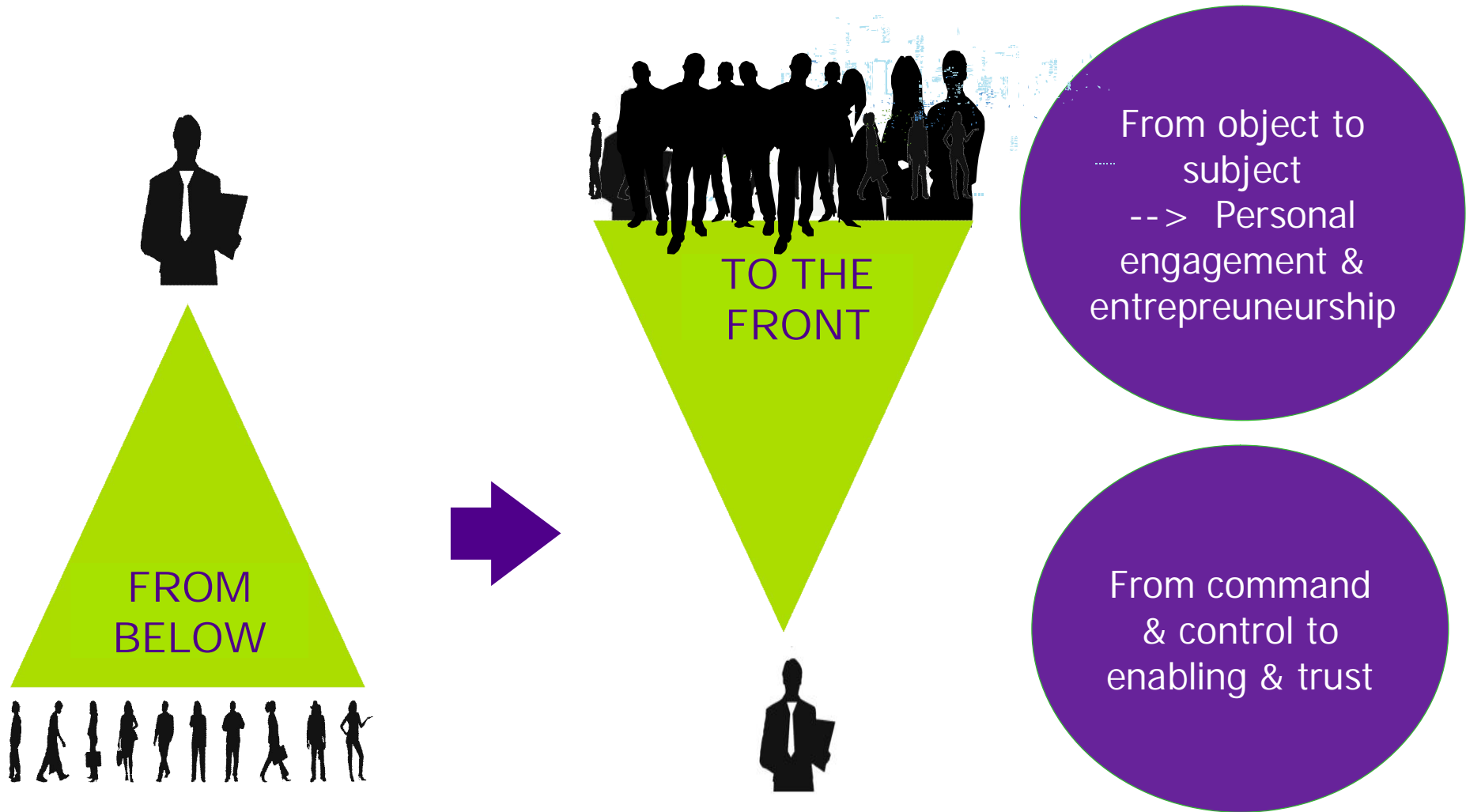


- Finland's traditional industrial structure is rapidly weakening

- Major need and opportunity for structural changes

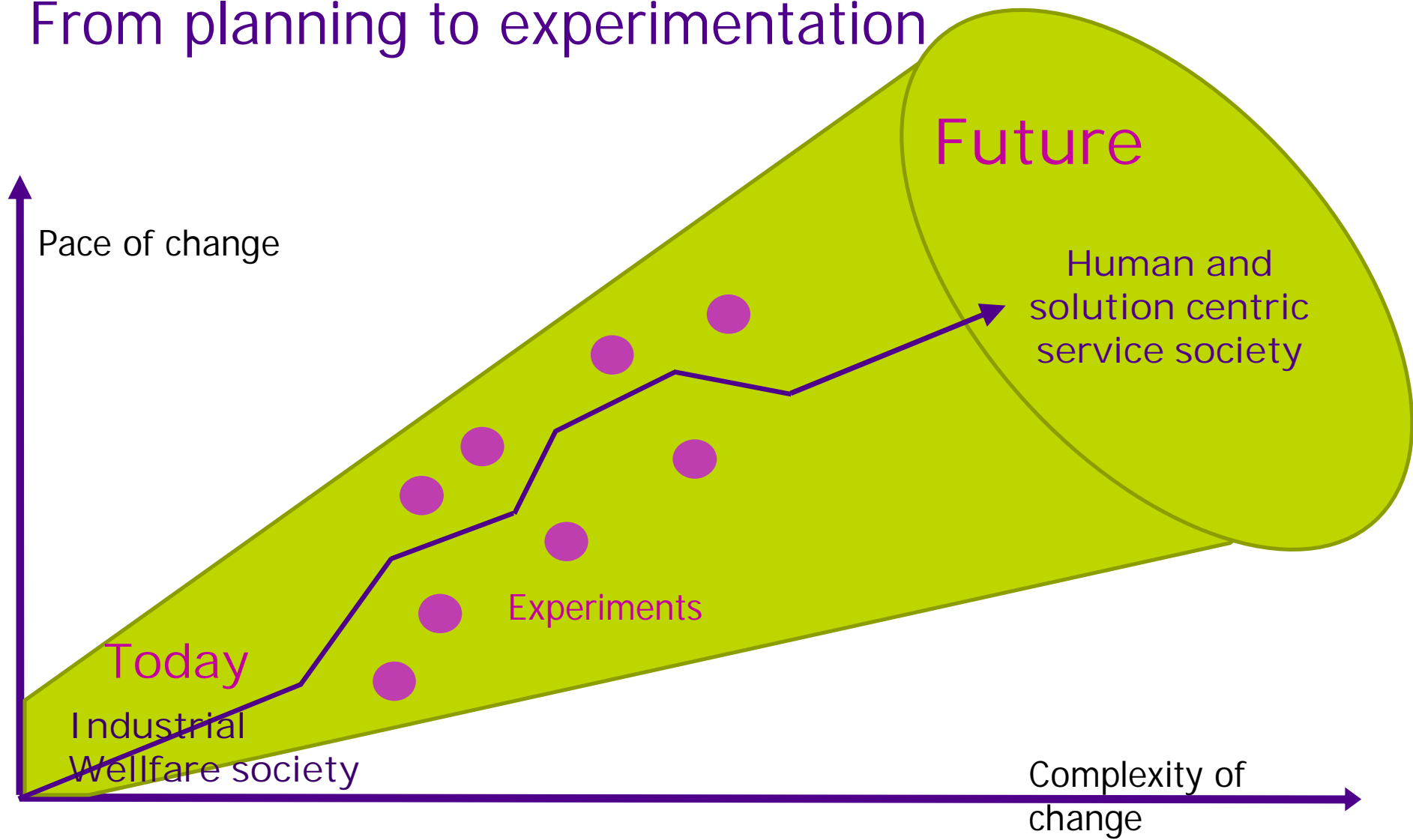
Finlands challenge: Sustainable renewal from industrial welfare society to human and solution centric service society

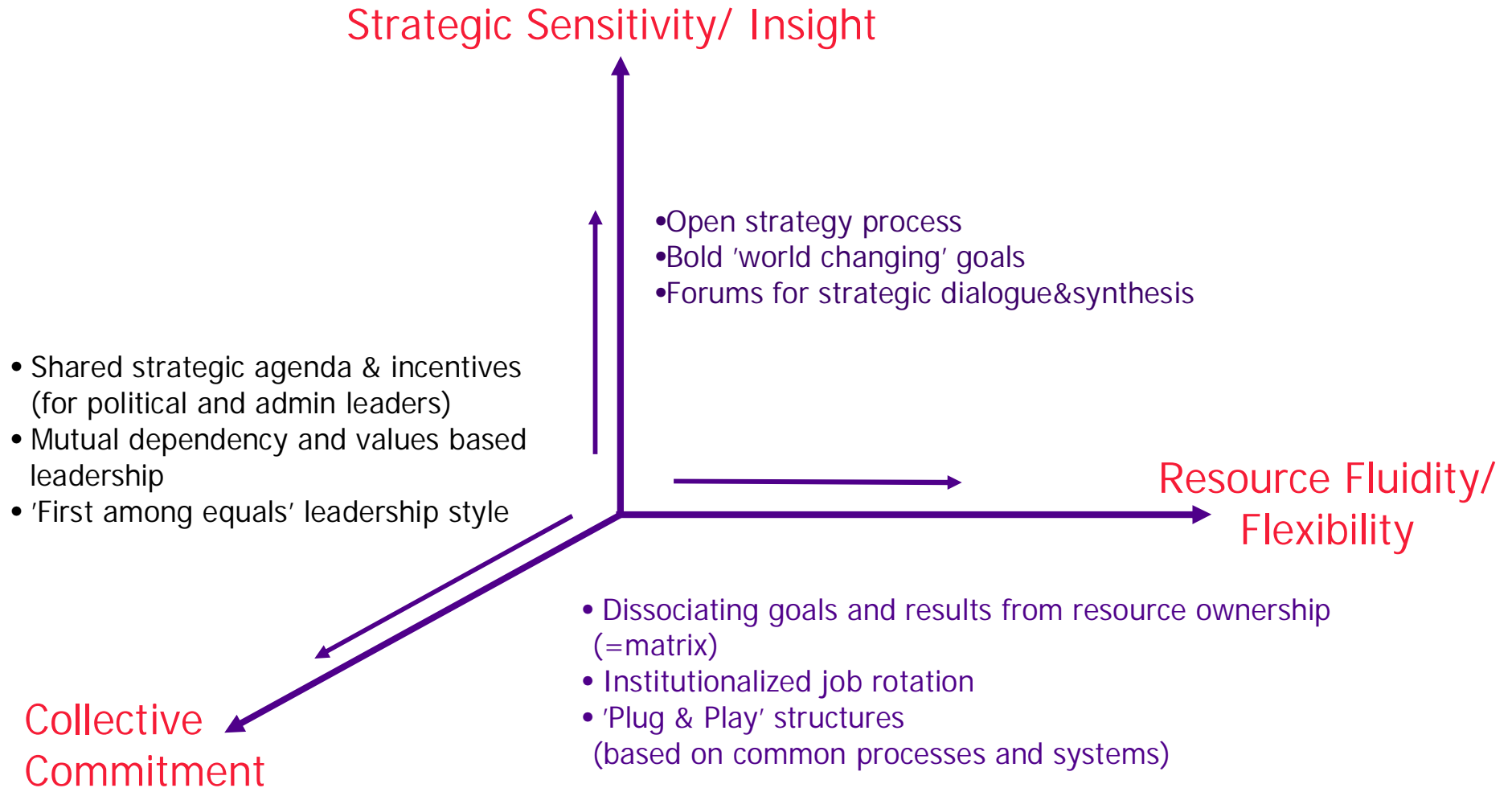

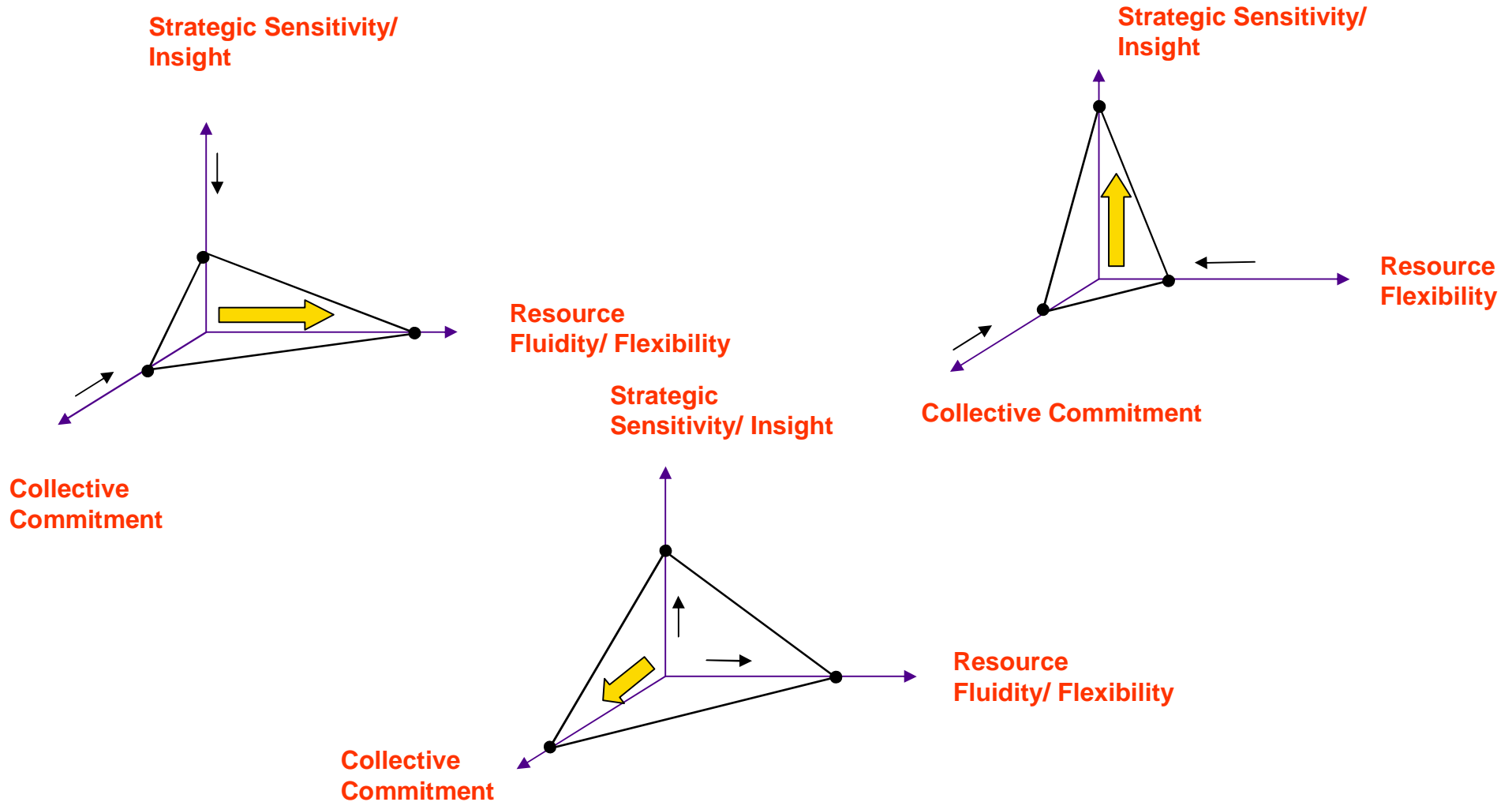
